Impact, Lessons Learned and Future Directions
<p>Impact and Evidence of Success</p> <p><i>Engage</i> will be evaluated through participant feedback surveys, engagement analytics within Canvas, and follow-up discussions with programme coordinators. These data will inform iterative updates to course content and design. The initial rollout in late 2025 will reach over 100 part-time ACE lecturers, indirectly enhancing the learning experience of more than 2,000 adult and lifelong learners annually. Early pilot feedback indicates strong engagement with short, practical materials and high relevance to teaching practice.</p> <p>Future Plans and Sustainability</p> <p>Following its initial launch, <i>Engage</i> will be embedded as a core professional development resource for all new ACE teaching staff. Feedback from participants will guide annual updates and module enhancements. Plans include extending access to other UCC part-time and occasional lecturers, developing complementary workshops, and integrating analytics to track engagement and impact. Sustaining <i>Engage</i> within Canvas ensures long-term accessibility, scalability, and alignment with UCC’s upcoming lifelong learning strategy.</p> <p>Top Tips</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Start with staff needs. Engage directly with part-time and early-career lecturers to identify practical challenges — design content that is concise, flexible, and directly applicable to their teaching contexts.Integrate, don’t duplicate. Align professional development with existing institutional policies, frameworks, and resources to ensure consistency and long-term sustainability.Iterate and evolve. Use participant feedback and analytics to continuously refine content, keeping it relevant, evidence-informed, and responsive to emerging teaching and learning priorities.

Initiative Description
<p>Aims and Objectives</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">To enhance the teaching and assessment practice of part-time lecturers through a flexible, evidence-informed digital learning resource.To promote inclusive, student-centred, and sustainable teaching aligned with UCC and national frameworks.To strengthen consistency and quality in assessment, feedback, and academic integrity across ACE programmes. To build a scalable model of professional development that supports lifelong learning and continuous improvement in teaching. <p>Outline or Description</p> <p>Overview</p> <p>The <i>Engage Project</i> is a professional development initiative created by Adult Continuing Education (ACE) at University College Cork (UCC) to support over 100+ part-time lecturers in enhancing their teaching and assessment practice. The initiative centres on a new, interactive Canvas-based course, <i>Engage: Teaching Lifelong Learners in Higher Education</i>, designed to introduce part-time lecturers to the principles of effective, inclusive, and evidence-informed teaching within the UCC context.</p> <p>Implementation</p> <p>The pilot version of <i>Engage</i> was developed throughout summer/autumn 2025 and will launch to all part-time ACE lecturers in late October 2025.</p> <p>Planning and Design</p> <p>The course was developed collaboratively by ACE management and programme coordinator teams, with input from UCC’s Centre for the Integration of Research, Teaching and Learning (CIRTL); Centre for Digital Education (CDE); and UCC’s academic integrity team. The design process focused on accessibility, engagement,</p> <p>and alignment with UCC’s Connected Curriculum principles. Each module combines instructional text, short videos, and guided supplementary resources. Contributors include ACE Managers, ACE Programme Coordinators, experienced UCC lecturers, and specialist staff, providing a grounded and collegial learning experience.</p> <p>Teaching and Learning Approach</p> <p>The course models best practice in adult and blended learning. Content is structured into short, self-paced modules that reflect key aspects of professional practice:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">Introduction to ACEYour first steps as an ACE lecturerTeaching adult learners at UCCPlanning and delivering effective teachingTeaching with technologyAssessment, marking and feedbackAcademic IntegrityUseful resources & next steps <p>Active learning is embedded through short reflective prompts, downloadable resources, and opportunities for lecturers to adapt examples to their own modules.</p> <p>Evaluation and Reflection</p> <p>While <i>Engage</i> is a professional development resource rather than an assessed course, it incorporates opportunities for reflection and feedback throughout. Participants are invited to consider how each topic applies to their own teaching and assessment practice, using reflective prompts and downloadable tools. At the end of the course, a participant survey gathers feedback on user experience, relevance, and impact. This data informs continuous improvement of the course content and design, ensuring it remains responsive to the evolving needs of ACE lecturers.</p>
